The 10th Industrial Accident Prevention Programme (FY2003-2007)

- 1. Elimination of fatal accidents
- 2. Ensuring occupational safety and health in small and medium-sized enterprises
- 3. Promotion of occupational health measures corresponding increase of the mental and physical burden at work

- 4. Development of safety and health management measures to reduce risk
- 5. Measures to meet diversification of employment form and mobilization of employment

JISHA's OSHMS Certification Services

- In March 2003
 JISHA started OSHMS certification services.
- 1) Upon request of a workplace, JISHA evaluates:
 - OSHMS construction level
 - OSHMS running status
- 2) The standards of the evaluation are based on the national guideline and the ILO OSHMS guidelines.

3) JISHA issues an OSHMS certificate with a metal plate.

In this month, JISHA certificated
 9 enterprises for the first time.

The Revised Guideline for Measures against Smoking at Work (May 2003)

The new guideline recommends three things:

- 1. Installation of smoking rooms for the prevention of passive smoking
- 2. Installation of ventilation systems which get rid of tobacco smoke and discharge smoke outside.
- 3. To maintain airflow (more than 0.2m/s) from non-smoking area to smoking area in order to prevent the inflow of tobacco smoke and smell to non-smoking area.
